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6 Stark Carpet's 'Lynx' woolen cut-pile Wilton is similar to the leopard-print carpeting in the elusive Ms W's house (page 66). In fact, if such a good match you'd be hard-pushed to spot the difference. It costs £105 per sq m. Ring 020 7352 6001 for stockists.

7 If you can't handle fitting out your kitchen units with sleek modern knobs, consider traditional pulls like those in the Malmborgs' house (page 95). Sun Valley Bronze makes a version which is available in six finishes and costs from \$32. Ring 001 208 788 3631.

8 Caricaturist Leonetto Cappiello took the French advertising world by storm in the early 20th century with striking poster designs such as the one hanging in Ms W's sitting room (page 65). He was clearly fond of green devilish-looking characters, as a similar figure appears here promoting a muscle-rub called Le Thermogène. This original costs £550 from vintage-poster dealer Liz Farrow (020 7706 1545).

9 It is refreshing to see someone use colour and pattern as confidently as Ms W has in her New York apartment (page 68). Her bold, multi-patterned scheme features the leaf-motif fabric 'Bouclé Franklin 32092-1' (£152 per m) by Clarence House (020 7351 1200). Shown here is the alternative colourway '32092-2'.

10 Gustavian furniture – such as the pieces owned by Ditte and Hans Malmborg (page 92) – was first fashionable in Sweden during the 18th century thanks to Gustav III's enthusiasm for the style. Gysinge-Sweden's particularly fine copies of Gustavian pieces are traditionally constructed by craftsmen using wood from old Swedish pine and birch trees. Pieces can be painted in any of the company's historic linseed-oil-based paints. Shown here is 'Bertil Karlsson', an 1800 country-style chair which costs approximately £268. Ring 00 46 291 21100.

11 Create a chequerboard floor similar to the green-and-yellow one in Ditte and Hans Malmborg's bathroom (page 96) using these Moroccan tiles from Habibi (020 8960 9203). The 10cm squares are hand-cut from a pre-fired slab of enamel-glazed earthenware, which accounts for the appealing rawness of the edges. £89 per sq m ■
